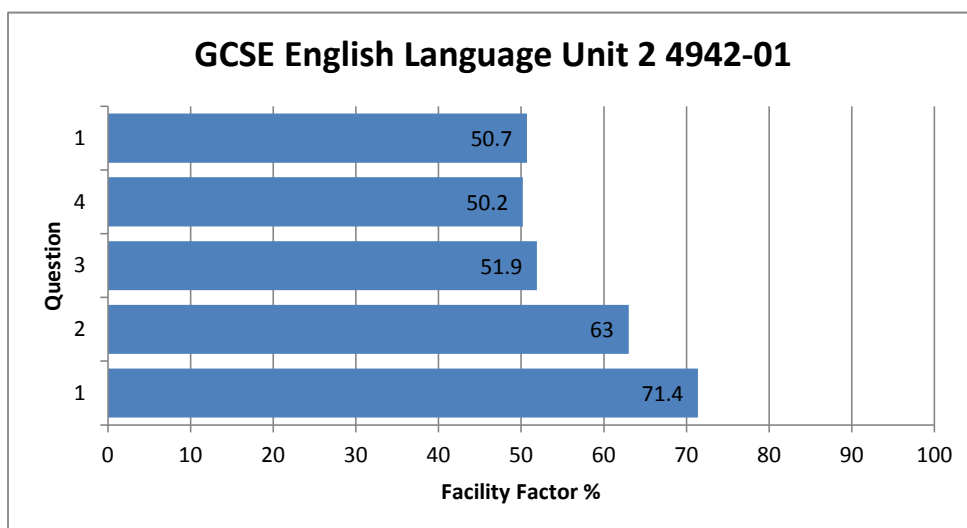

They say there will be more 'slaughter' happening in England soon. They use the word slaughter to emphasize the mass cull on these badgers to try and make readers support save the badgers. They also bring in some facts about places in Britain where TB/culling has occurred, they say that

there was a cull in Ireland but say TB still remains a problem and say they are trying vaccines. They also state that there are no badgers on the island of Anglesey but TB still occurs there. They say they are sympathetic towards farmers and are concerned about cows, but want to try vaccines rather than culling and feel it would be more effective. They want to stop the cases of TB in cows, and at the same time don't want badgers to be culled. At the end of the leaflet in big bold writing it says "SAY NO TO KILLING BADGERS" trying to emphasize the message one final time.
