The belief that Jesus' death on the cross healed the rift between humans and God.

Preaching of the gospel to others with the intention of converting others to the Christian faith.



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God becoming human in the form of Jesus.

The state of being allloving and infinitely good- a characteristic often attributed to God.

The all-powerful, almighty and unlimited nature of God.

The belief that Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Sunday, thereby conquering death.



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A belief that there is life after death. For example, that the soul continues to exist after the physical death of the body.

The Christian teaching found in the New Testament that Jesus was taken up to Heaven in bodily form 40 days after his resurrection.

An outward sign of an invisible and inward blessing by God. For example Baptism, Eucharist.

The act of making something out of nothing. For example, God creating the world ex nihilo / Humans were created in God's image.



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The three persons of the Christian godhead e.g God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

An ancient Roman form of killing someone by nailing or tying his or her hands and feet to a cross.

Churches from different denominations working together to promote unity.

Christian belief and study of 'end times' focusing on death, judgement and the final destiny of the soul and of humankind.



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A strong belief in something or someone e.g. God.

A pardoning of human sin by God.

The belief that God will judge if humans are worthy to enter the Kingdom of Heaven at the end of time.

The acceptance of events having taken place exactly as written or recorded.



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The understanding that Bible is the word of God, but that it needs to be read and understood in its appropriate context.

The belief that God is all-knowing, all wise and all seeing.

A journey made to a sacred place as an act of worship or devotion.



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Communicating with God.

The revealing of knowledge through communication with God.

Going against God's divine law or expectations of us. An expression of adoration towards something or someone deserving: e.g. God.



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Something holy, special and to be honoured as it relates to God.

A deliverance from sin and punishment as a result of Jesus being crucified on the cross.

A set pattern, form and style of worship used by some Christian denominations.

The ending of the separation between God and humanity caused by original sin.



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
