


The book of Job – sort the statements.

The book of Job – sort the statements.

Job	 A faithful, upright and blameless man God may not be just Curses the day he was born Loses everything Challenges God Why do innocent people suffer when wicked people prosper? Lives over 140 years!
Job's Wife	 Loses everything Curse God and die!
The Three Friends, Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar	 God is just and Job must have done evil Job is dishonest about his actions God would never be unjust Job's constant questioning of God's ways is rebellious and disrespectful
Elihu	• God is just, but sometimes makes good people suffer so they can be warned against living a bad life and can experience God's love and forgiveness
God	 Allows Job to be tested by Satan Boasts that Job is a faithful, upright and blameless man Restores Job's fortune, good health and children Tells Job that his view of the world is limited, and he cannot possibly understand how complicated divine justice is Offers Job a chance to run the world for a day Appeared as a whirlwind
Satan	 Agrees that Job is a faithful, upright and blameless man It is easy for Job to be upright and blameless if he has all of God's blessings If Job experiences hardship, he'll turn away from God
